How to Play

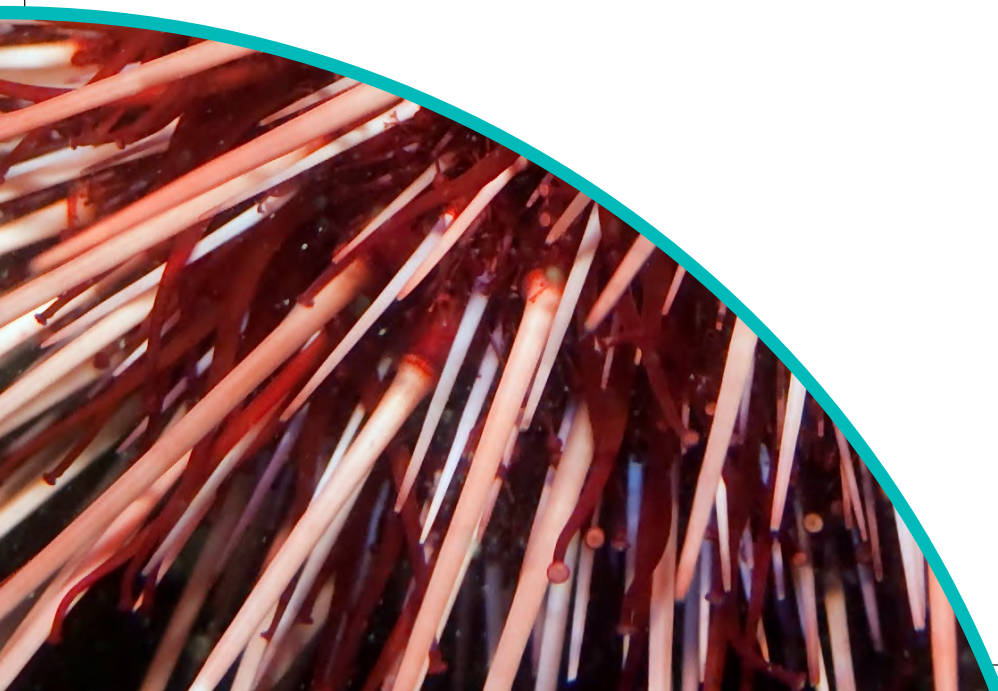
1. You can print this game out or play it online.

What you need to know

Oceans cover more than 70% of Earth's surface. A million or so different species, including fish (like a shark or a salmon), mammals (like a sea otter or a walrus) and mollusks (like an octopus, a squid or a clam), live in the oceans. The largest animal in the world—the blue whale—is a marine animal. But small, spineless animals make up 95% of all the animals living in our oceans.

Canada has the longest coastline in the world, measuring more than 243,000 kilometres. We are bordered on three sides by oceans: the Pacific, the Atlantic and the Arctic.

Our coastal waters are home to whales and dolphins, sea lions and basking sharks, Leatherback sea turtles and walruses.

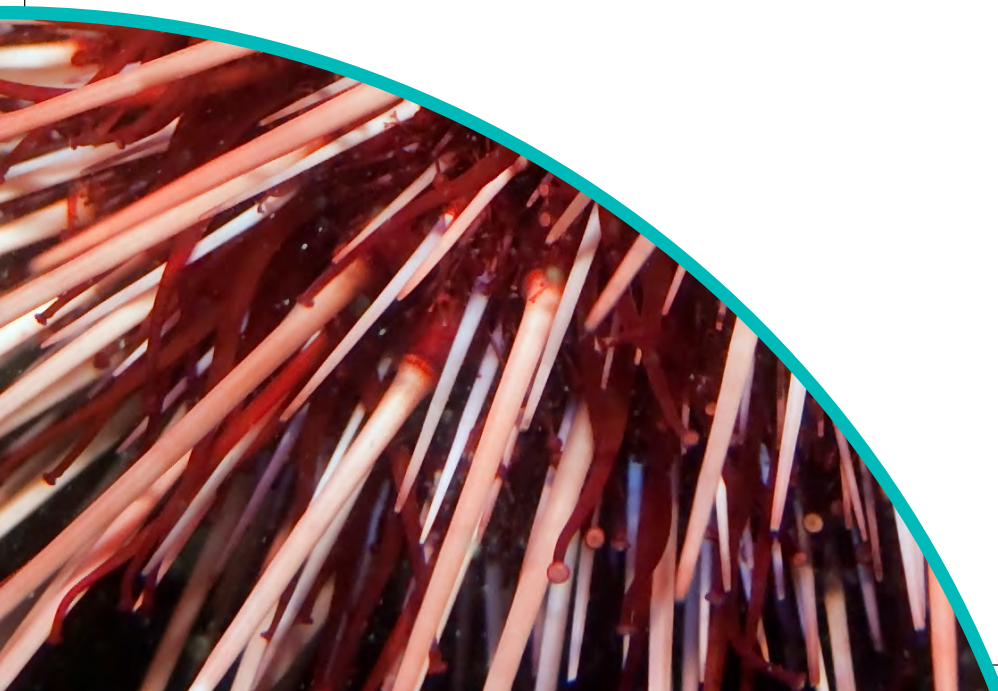
